ENTRY and BANQUET REGISTRATION DEADLINES

All images of art entered in the symposium exhibition must be emailed to Pat Zalisko by 3/1/16 at pzalisko@yahoo.com and to Cheryl Fausel at cherartist@aol.com. Images must be emailed in the following format: lastname title dimensions

medium_price. Images should be sent as jpegs, and measure 1800 pixels on the longest side.

Two-dimensional work must not exceed 50" wide. Threedimensional work must not exceed 200 lbs. in weight. All two-dimensional work must be properly wired: saw tooth hardware will not be accepted. Work framed and covered must be under Plexiglas: glass will not be accepted. Three-dimensional work requiring a pedestal should be identified in the artist's entry. The Center for the Arts of Bonita Springs can provide pedestals and every effort will be made to accommodate the artist's wishes. Consistent with FLAG's policy, no work that is POR (price on request) or NFS (not for sale) will be exhibited.



SHIPPED AND DELIVERED WORK

Those hand-delivering their work must do so on Friday, March 25th between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. at the Center for the Arts of Bonita Springs. The Center is located at 26100 Old US 41, Bonita Springs FL 34135. Strike down is Friday, April 29th between the hours of 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. at the same address. All art must be picked up on that date and during those times. Shipped work must be received between March 21st and 24th, 2016 to FLAG's designated delivery service for this symposium. Shipped work should be sent, via the artist's preferred carrier (e.g., USPS, UPS, FedEX, courier) to Richard Reichow, c/o My Garage LLC, 7225 Sanibel Blvd. #24, Fort Myers, FL 33908. Tel: (239) 273-9568. Those shipping their work through their own carrier to the designated FLAG delivery service must include a separate check made payable to Richard Reichow in the amount of \$35. This fee covers the costs of receiving, handling, unpacking, shortterm storage, and delivering and retrieving the work from the Center for the Arts on the designated receiving and strike down dates, and shipping the returned work via the artist's carrier. All shipped work must include a return, prepaid shipping label for the artist's carrier.

All hand-delivered work must be received at the Center for the Arts of Bonita Springs on March 25th between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Work delivered outside those dates or times cannot be accepted for exhibition.

Lunch on your own. Lunch is available in the Eagle's Nest, the Hotel's Atrium restaurant. Numerous restaurants are within a short driving/shuttle ride of the hotel.

12 – 2:00 p.m. – members are free to enjoy sights or shopping in the area (see below) or return to the annual exhibition to view the work at the Art Center.

Buffet breakfast for hotel guests, discounted breakfast buffet for FLAG guests not staying at the hotel.


Board of Directors meeting – 10 a.m., Boardroom. General members of the FLAG are welcome to attend this meeting.




HOTEL RESERVATIONS

Artists may reserve at the Embassy Suites Hotel & Conference Center, located at 10450 Corkscrew Commons Dr., Estero. The group rate for "FLAG" is \$144 per night. Guests must call the hotel directly at (239) 949-4222 in order to secure this rate and identify their affiliation with FLAG or the Florida Artists Group.

The Embassy is a Hilton affiliate: those who are Hilton Honors members may want to seek points for this stay. All rooms are suites. There are rooms available for accommodating special needs. The hotel has a shuttle that can escort guests within a five-mile radius. The shuttle is not available to take anyone to the Baker Museum and Artis-Naples.

Happy hour (wine, beer, well drinks) and a generous buffet breakfast are included for registered hotel guests. FLAG guests not staying at the hotel will receive discounted tickets for breakfast.

ARTIS-NAPLES – The Baker Museum and the Philharmonic: 58833 Pelican Bay Boulevard, Naples, FL 34108-2740

ARTIS-NAPLES - is home to Dawn's Forest, the largest known Louise Nevelson sculpture. Also underway during our symposium are two significant exhibitions, which supplement the museum's extensive permanent collection: *Naples Collects and Florida Contemporary*. The latter is a juried exhibition of work by sixteen invited contemporary artists selected by the curator.

EXHIBITION GUIDELINES

Art work should have been created in the last three years. All other work must have Plexiglas for framing. Artwork needs to be wired and ready to hang. No saw tooth hanging hardware will be accepted. Be sure to send, clean, scratch free frame and Plexiglas. Unprofessional framing may be rejected, by the hanging committee, or the director of the gallery. Be sure to include size, price and medium. Title and price on entry form, and the original art work, must match. Work must be for sale.

Inform Pat Zalisko, if your work requires a pedestal, for availability. Tel: (386) 214-0300.

The judging will be blind as befits protocol for judging an exhibition of this caliber.
