



#### **FOREWORD**

The Ninth annual Symposium and Exhibition of the Florida Artist Group was held at the galleries of the Tampa Art Institute in Tampa, Florida, on March 27, 28, and 29, 1958.

The convention opened on Thursday evening, March 27, with a preview of the exhibition, numbering 95 paintings sent to this 9th annual by as many artist members from all parts of the State.

Fred Conway, noted mural painter of the St. Louis School of Fine Arts, acting as sole juror, selected 30 paintings for circuit to form the present exhibition.

Florida Artist Group exhibitions are selected by the one-man jury system, always a man of national stature in the art world. Such distinguished leaders in the field of fine arts as Robert Parsons, Bartlett Hayes Jr., Lamar Dodd, Homer Saint-Gaudens, Wilbur D. Peat, Thomas M. Beggs, and Robert B. Hale have served as jurors in previous years.

#### SYMPOSIUM, 1958

The annual Symposium and Exhibition is held each year in a different city in Florida; Gainesville, Clearwater, Sarasota, Daytona Beach, West Palm Beach, Bradenton, Winter Park and Tampa have entertained the Group.


In March, 1958, the spacious new galleries of the Tampa Art Institute served as headquarters for the sessions, with the Hotel Hillsboro as official hotel for the convention. The members' meeting was held at the Tampa Art Institute.

Speakers at the orientation program were Dr. Robert Carson, Dept. of Humanities, University of Florida, Chairman; Mr. Kenneth Donahue, Director, the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art; Mr. William Eaton, Architect; Mr. Clayton Charles, Art Dept., University of Miami; and Mr. Fred Conway, guest juror.

The subject of the panel discussion was "Why Art in Public Buildings and the need for a State Art Commission?" On the basis of this discussion it is proposed that a plan for an art commission and a method for securing art in public buildings be worked out, later to be presented to Governor Collins and the State building commissioners. Members of the panel taking part in this discussion were: Mr. Hilton Leech, Director Amagansett School of Art, Sarasota, Chairman; Mr. Robert M. Little, A.I.A., Chairman of the South Florida University Architectural Planners; Mr. Willis F. Woods, Director Norton Gallery and School of Art, West Palm Beach; Miss Thelma Brownett, Secretary, The Georgia Art Commission; Mr. Stuart Purser, Department of Art, University of Florida; Mr. Louis Freund, Resident Artist, Stetson University; Dr. John S. Allen, President, South Florida University.


#### STATE ART COMMISSION

The discussion carried on at the 9th annual symposium, at the Tampa Art Institute, centered on the establishment of a state art commission for Florida. Suggestions made by Lawrence Dame, art critic, as to the functions of the proposed commission, were to supervise installation of art exhibits and decoration in public buildings; administer gifts of art to the state and funds in the art field; to institute educational programs in art, possibly stemming from state universities; organize lectures in art appreciation; effect a co-ordination of efforts with the State Publicity Bureau; appoint a secretary with liaisons with civic organizations, newspapers and national art magazines. The idea was advanced that Florida is a new state, pioneering in many fields, and that Florida's state art commission should be cut to a new pattern.




