From the President

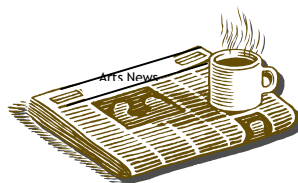

Titled "Origyn: Homage to Womanhood," **Peppi Elona's** solo show at the Venice Art Center was on exhibit January 8 to January 27.



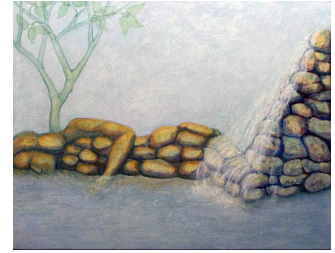

She hopes the FLAG members in the Naples/Marco Island area will tour all the sculptures on display thru April 15. She also won *First Place* in the Open Juried Florida Artist's Registry Exhibit at the Gallery at Avalon Island, Orlando. She was awarded her third *United Arts of Central Florida Professional Development Grant* to study with a national bronze sculptor near Sedona, AZ. Life-size "Wind Dancer Pegasus" has been purchased by the Honors College at the University of Central Florida and will be installed in March. The unveiling is being planned for April to celebrate their 10 year anniversary. 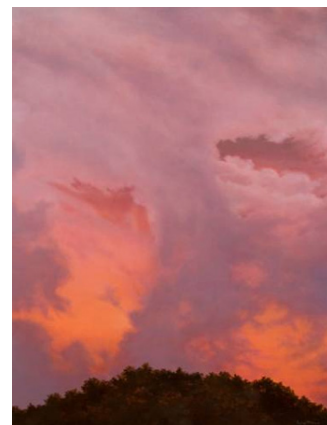

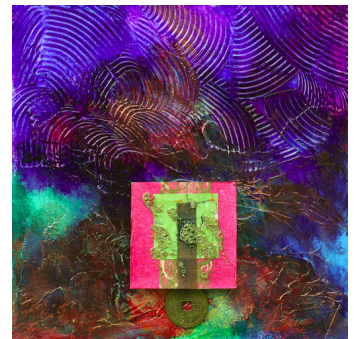

In Memory

Mamie Harrison, Area IV, died Oct. 13, 2007. She was 92. Mamie was President of FLAG in 1985 and 1986. Mamie was born in Spring-town, TX in 1915. She went to Business College in Fort Worth, TX. In 1938, she moved to Florida and married. During World War II, while her husband was in the Air Force, she joined and became active in the Daughters of the American Revolution. For her entire life she was active in her community. She was Past President of the Dunedin Youth Center, a founding member of Play PARC, a charter member and Past President of Studio 1212 Clearwater, Past

President of Florida Artist Group, a statewide organization, a member of the YWCA Board of Directors, and later the Senior Board for the YWCA, was on the Board of Trustees for the Red Cross and Community Chest, and was a long time member of the Carlouel Yacht Club. She traveled extensively in North America, Europe and Russia. Her travels encouraged her interest in art and she won many awards for her artwork and participated in numerous regional and state exhibitions. In 2002 she was elected to the Dunedin Senior Hall of Fame, by the Committee on Aging, City of Dunedin.
