Long-time Area VII FIAG member, Jean Dean, passed away on July 29th in Maine. "She was an outspoken feminist and champion of the rights of minorities - whether it was women, blacks, Native Americans or gays, she felt very passionately about these things. She could not physically get involved, but she tried to speak through her art," said her longtime friend Gaye Gilmore of Naples. Over the course of 45 years, she explored all sorts of artistic genres - landscape, watercolor, ceramics and mixed media. She found that abstract acrylic painting was her true calling. The Deans moved to Cape Coral in 1963, a time when there were precious few people here, let alone art lovers who appreciated abstract expression. They relocated to Fort Myers in 1989. She knew she could make more money painting


palm trees and subtropical sunsets, but she steadfastly refused to compromise. "An artist has to be true to herself," she said in a 2002 interview with The News-Press. And so she continued to create her abstract images, using the vivid hues that became her trademark.
