Established in 1949 by art leaders and University professors including President of Rollins College, Hugh McKean; The Norton Gallery Director (now Norton Museum), Robert Hunter; University of Florida Art Professor, Hollis Holbrook; and Hilton Leech who organized the Ringling School of Art to name a few.

Annual Exhibit and Symposium:

FLAG holds an Annual Exhibit and Symposium. The events are held in a different Florida city each year. Annual Exhibit: Members may participate in the annual FLAG exhibition. The selected juror is an out-of-state highly distinguished experienced professional in the visual art field such as an exceptional artist, curator, art professor or museum director.

- Must reside in Florida for at least 6 months. Time frame may be further limited by the Board of Directors
